



IMPORTANT UPDATE | SELF ASSESSMENT AND SAFETY GUIDELINES

Dear parents and guardians,

I hope you and your loved ones are doing well. The first week of the return to in-person learning for all our schools is drawing to a close and I would like to thank you for your support. Thanks to you and the staff and due to the respect we all have for health and safety instructions, your child's return was able to take place safely.

REMINDER - Self-assessment

- We remind you to complete the COVID-19 Symptom Self-Assessment for each of your children every morning. This is available on your child's school website and on the <u>CEPEO website</u>.
- As of February 10, every student in Grades 9 to 12 will be required to verbally confirm to their teacher that they have completed the self-assessment and that the results indicate that they can attend school.

Self-assessment tools:

- **Students from Ottawa schools only**: Grades 9 to 12 students from De La Salle, Gisèle-Lalonde, Louis-Riel, Maurice-Lapointe and Omer-Deslauriers will be required to complete the <u>Ottawa Public Health Self-Assessment Tool</u>. This is available on the website of the concerned schools.
- Students from schools outside of Ottawa: Grades 9 to 12 students from all other schools will be asked to complete their region's self-assessment tool available on the school's website.

REMINDER - Wearing a mask

Wearing a mask remains mandatory for all students in grades 1 to 12 and is strongly encouraged for kindergarten and senior kindergarten students. By wearing a mask, your child protects themself and everyone they come into contact with.

We realize that it is not always easy to explain to your children the importance of wearing a mask. We therefore encourage you to consult regional public health unit websites, which contain several resources on the types of masks to choose and how to wear them effectively to ensure your safety and that of others.
