DETAILS: Vaccination for 5 to 11 year olds

As you know, the COVID-19 vaccination campaign for children aged 5 to 11 is underway. In this regard, we would like to provide the following clarifications.


- Vaccination clinics will be set up in certain schools within our Board. Their operation hours will be in the evenings and on weekends, outside of school hours.
- Parental consent is required, both when making the appointment and during the administration of the vaccine.

Mandatory vaccination administrative directive

As you know, a <u>mandatory vaccination directive</u> for staff and visitors was due to go into effect on December 3. Please note that the implementation of this directive has been postponed until January 31, 2022.



This decision was taken in order to give more time to recruit the necessary staff to fill the positions left vacant by the non-vaccinated staff members and to establish special agreements with the staff in the process of being vaccinated. In the meantime, unvaccinated staff will continue to comply with the requirement to provide management with a negative result 3 times per week as required by the Ministry of Education.

REMINDER: International travel

We remind you of the importance of following federal international travel guidelines and quarantine requirements to protect students and staff.

Upon returning from international travel, travelers must adhere to federal testing and quarantine requirements, notably, self-quarantine, not attending school or child care if such a request has been made.

Additionally, unvaccinated children under the age of 12 who have traveled internationally with a fully vaccinated person, although exempt from federal quarantine, are not permitted to attend school or child care during 14 days after their return, in accordance with provincial government requirements.

Rapid antigen testing kits

We would like to advise you that the Ministry of Education will soon be providing schools with rapid antigen screening kits. Each student will receive one of these kits, which will allow 5 screening tests to be performed at home during the holiday break. Full details on how these kits will work will be communicated to you in the coming weeks.

Return of semesters for all secondary school students

All CEPEO secondary schools will return to semester mode from January 31, 2022.

Community use of school facilities

From February 1, 2022, subject to a favorable sanitary situation and sufficient janitorial staff, certain school facilities may be made available to the community. This will be done in a selective and progressive manner which will make it possible to accommodate community partners while ensuring the expected level of sanitation in schools.
