### Back to school guide


Our main 2021-2022 Back to School Guide is now available here. This will help you prepare for the school year and better understand how our schools will operate. Of note, the Guide contains useful information on our safety and health measures to ensure everyone's well-being.

The measures listed in our Guide are subject to change, depending on the evolution of the health situation and provincial government and public health authorities instructions. We ask that you check your emails and social media channels from your child's school and our school board regularly to keep up to date. ### Masks

Wearing a medical or fabric mask inside the school, in the hallways, in the classroom is mandatory for students in Grades 1 to 12.

Wearing a mask is strongly encouraged for Kindergarten and Preschool students.



Wearing a mask is mandatory for all Kindergarten to Grade 12 students on school buses. You will find all you need to know about wearing a mask in the Main Back-to-School Guide.

## Ventilation

CEPEO meets <u>all Ministry of Education ventilation requirements</u> and will continue to optimize the air quality in its schools by improving ventilation and filtration.

## Daily Symptom Self-Assessment

The daily self-assessment for COVID-19 symptoms remains mandatory for all students and learners before they arrive at school. The self-assessment tools are available on the <u>CEPEO</u> <u>website</u> and on your child's school website. An update is expected from government and public health authorities in the near future.

Students in Grades 9 to 12 must confirm daily, in the classroom, that they have completed the COVID-19 Symptom Self-Assessment Form. This form is part of the tools available on the <u>CEPEO website</u> and on your child's school's website.

### Mandatory Employee Immunization Disclosure Policy

The Ontario government has announced details of the mandatory disclosure policy for COVID-19 immunization for school boards and school employees. We invite you to read the press release by <u>clicking on this link</u>. We are currently analyzing how to apply these new measures. We will communicate further details to you shortly.

### Vaccination of Children Born in 2009

The government also announced that all children <u>who turn 12 by the end of 2021</u> are eligible to receive their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Appointments can be made using the <u>Provincial</u> <u>Appointment System</u>, or contacting the public health unit or pharmacies in their region. Alternatively, individuals can go to one of the vaccination centers in the province. We invite you to consult <u>this link</u> for more information.
